Arrangements in Poor Weather

As you are aware, we recently suffered severe weather conditions in Tow Law and, although our school remained open, attendance was extremely poor. Therefore, I should like to clarify with you our school's procedures should we have to close the school in the case of bad weather and also our stance on attendance should the school remain open to pupils.

If the decision is made to close the school, we will firstly submit information of the closure to the Durham County Council website. Parents may access this by logging onto the website at **www.durham.gov.uk** and choosing the following options:

- Schools and Education
- Temporary school closures

Please scroll down to find out if our school is listed.

Secondly, we will send the information out by text. It is very important that we have an **up-to-date** mobile number for you in order for you to receive our information bulletins. It is **your responsibility** to keep the school informed of such changes. Please call the Office immediately should you not be receiving our texts and we will update your contact details.

Thirdly, we will inform BBC Radio Newcastle of our closure in the case of bad weather.

If the weather is bad but the school remains <u>open</u>, the following applies (taken from The Department for Education and Skills (DfES) Guidance:

- pupils who do not live within walking distance and are unable to attend school because of the weather conditions, ie those who travel in a taxi, will be given a "Y" code, which means "Unable to attend due to exceptional circumstances". This will not affect their overall attendance figure;
- pupils who live in Tow Law and are able to <u>walk</u> to school but do not attend will be given an *unauthorised* absence.

It is therefore expected that, unless there are exceptional circumstances, all pupils within walking distance should attend school.

If the weather is particularly bad, can parents send a change of clothes/shoes with your child that they can change into once in school.
