Tow Law Millennium Primary School - Early years pupil premium

The EYPP is additional funding, up to £302 per year per child, for early years settings to improve the education they provide for disadvantaged 3- and 4-year olds.

Who can apply

You can apply for early years pupil premium if your child is aged 3 or 4 and you get 15 hours free childcare.

You must also get at least one of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based <u>Jobseeker's Allowance</u>
- income-related <u>Employment and Support Allowance</u>
- support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of <u>State Pension Credit</u>
- Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit) and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on, which is paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit your household income must be less than £7,400 a year after tax not including any benefits you get

You may also get early years pupil premium if your child is currently being looked after by a local authority in England or Wales or if your child has left care in England or Wales through:

- adoption
- special guardianship order
- a child arrangements order
