At Tow Law Millennium Primary School

In <u>2022 – 2023</u>, Tow Law Millennium Primary School is due to receive <u>£16,926</u> Primary PE & School Sport Premium. This will be used to raise standards in curriculum **Physical Education**, **School Sport**, **Physical Activity** and Healthy living (PESSPA).

Vision: For ALL pupils leaving primary school to be **physically literate** and with the **knowledge**, **skills and motivation** necessary to equip them for a **healthy**, **active lifestyle** and **lifelong participation** in physical activity and sport.

Objective: To build **capability** within school and achieve **self-sustaining improvement** in the **quality** of PE and sport in primary schools against the 5 key grant condition indicators:

- 1. the engagement of <u>all</u> pupils in regular physical activity kick-starting healthy active lifestyles. Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that primary school children undertake at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day in school.
- 2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- 3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- 5. increased participation in competitive sport
