

Early Years Pupil Premium Strategy Statement 2022-2023

Tow Law Millennium Primary School - Early years pupil premium

The EYPP is additional funding, up to £342 per year per child, for early years settings to improve the education they provide for disadvantaged 3- and 4-year olds.

Who can apply

You can apply for early years pupil premium if your child is aged 3 or 4 and you get [15 hours free childcare](#).

You must also get at least one of the following:

- [Income Support](#)
- income-based [Jobseeker's Allowance](#)
- income-related [Employment and Support Allowance](#)
- support under [part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999](#)
- the guaranteed element of [State Pension Credit](#)
- [Child Tax Credit](#) (provided you are not also entitled to [Working Tax Credit](#)) and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- [Working Tax Credit](#) run-on, which is paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit - your household income must be less than £7,400 a year after tax not including any benefits you get

You may also get early years pupil premium if your child is currently being looked after by a local authority in England or Wales or if your child has left care in England or Wales through:

- adoption
- special guardianship order
- a child arrangements order
